MATHLETICS REPORT

This school year promises to be packed with tonnes of special events for all of the "Mathletes" here at school.

New this year - for the first time ever at St. Benedict - the **Canadian National Math League Contest** is up and running. This monthly challenge, organized by the University of Windsor, started on *Tuesday, October 21st 2008*, with 16 participants. Our next edition will be held on *Tuesday, November 18th*. Watch for details about time, location, and opportunities to practice! In fact, the semi-weekly-meeting "Math Club" gets together every Tuesday and Wednesday to do just this!

The **Canadian Open Math Challenge** is a once-a-year test of computing skills runs courtesy of the University of Waterloo. This year, students will be competing on *November 19th*.

Now in its third year, the **Math @ MAC** on-line contest is taking place on *November 27th*. This competition, where students are able to sign up in teams of two, is hosted by McMaster University, and has been growing in popularity - maybe because the top prizes are not just pride or prestige - but CASH!!! Students from all grades are eligible to complete - and just for the record, in the last 2 years, the top winners have all been grade 9's! Seniors - let's show them how it's done!

Mathlete spirit wear will be making an appearance before Christmas time-- so if you are interested in picking up some special holiday gift-giving items, why not think about getting that Math Geek on your list a cool baseball-style t-shirt to advertise their love of the subject.

On February 18th, grade 9, 10 and 11 students will be participating in the **Pascal, Cayley and Fermat** contests, again hosted by the University of Waterloo. We have had some terrific results over the past few years, but let's make this year even more impressive!

By April 7th, grade 12 students were anxious to take their chances at the **Grade 12 Euclid** contest - also hosted by the U of W.

Finally, the last set of competitions organized by the University of Waterloo is advertised as its "Elite Series" for Grade 9, 10 and 11 students. Watch for more details about the **Fryer, Galois**, and **Hypatia** math challenges on April 8th

If you're on the third floor, watch out for the all-new *Math Wall of Fame*. We'd like to take the time to recognize all the hard work and dedication shown by the students that continue to work above and beyond the call of duty in challenging themselves mathematically. Good work, everyone!!!
