SUN LIFE FINANCIAL CANADIAN OPEN MATHEMATICS CHALLENGE

Congratulations to Ara Cho and James Kyeong, the two students who represented St. Benedict at this year's Canadian Open Math Challenge in November. Sponsored by Sun Life Financial, this contest calls on Math students to perform challenging algorithms and complete complex problem-solving questions. Both competitors performed admirably.

UNIVERSITY OF WATERLOO JUNIOR MATH CONTESTS

In February, St. Benedict had 14 students in Grade 9 and 10 competing in the Pascal and Cayley Math Contests, sponsored by the University of Waterloo's Centre for Education in Mathematics and Computing. Special recognition goes out to Daniyal Abdali and Evan Peng, who tied as school champions, scoring well over 100 in the Cayley contest. Ara Cho, Gabriel DeSousa, Nathan Tierney and Ante Dodig also scored above the provincial average. In Grade 9, Nathan Schmidt achieved and unheard-of score of 120 on the Pascal Contest, followed closely behind by Sabrina Sikora. Peter Reynolds and Talal Abdali join the "over 100 club" for our grade 9 team. We look forward to next year, when these young people try their hands at the next generation of math contests in 2009/2010.

UNIVERSITY OF WATERLOO'S ELITE JUNIOR MATH CONTESTS

An outstanding group of Grade 9, 10 and 11 students participated in this year's Fryer, Galois, and Hypatia Contests in early April. In Grade 9, the team of Nathan Schmidt and Kaitlin Kok had an outstanding showing, coupled with impressive results from our Grade 10 team of Daniyal Abdali and Evan Peng. The Grade 11's would not be outdone, with notable showings from Jason Charbonneau, Harpreet Brar and Chris Kok. Congratulations on a job well done - and we look forward to next year!

GRADE 12 EUCLID MATH CONTEST

All grade 9's enrolled in either Grade 9 Applied or Academic Math classes during semester 2 will be writing the EQAO's provincial Math Test over two days - on Tuesday, June 9th and Wednesday, June 10th. This test will be written during their regularly-scheduled Math class, and will take the full period on both days. It is important that students be prepared for this test, since the EQAO is worth half of their final exam, or 15% of their final, overall mark. Students should already be preparing in their classes by working on practice materials provided by their teacher, but there are also tonnes of on-line resources available to families so that students can practice at home. Just check out the official website: eqao.com for tests from previous years, complete solutions, tips and reminders, as well as useful links. Lots of luck to all those Grade 9's participating.
