### CALLING ALL GRADUATES

Although we have not yet formally said "good-bye" to our Grade 12 class as of yet, plans are well underway to welcome them back to St. Benedict on **Friday, October 29, 2010** for our annual Graduation celebration. Grade 12 students are reminded that if they are planning to attend the October celebration, they must **complete their graduation forms and pay their graduation fee by Friday, June 11**. Completed forms and fees can be handed in at the Guidance Office. Potential Graduates are also reminded of the importance of completing the mandatory 40 hours of Community Service prior to the end of June in order to meet diploma requirements.

### SUMMER SCHOOL

Summer school will be available this summer for St. Benedict students through the Waterloo Region District School Board, our coterminous board this summer. Make-up credit courses will be offered at Jacob Hespeler Secondary School in Cambridge and Cameron Heights Secondary School in Kitchener. *Our new literary arts magazine, Halo, has been published just in time for your summer reading pleasure.*

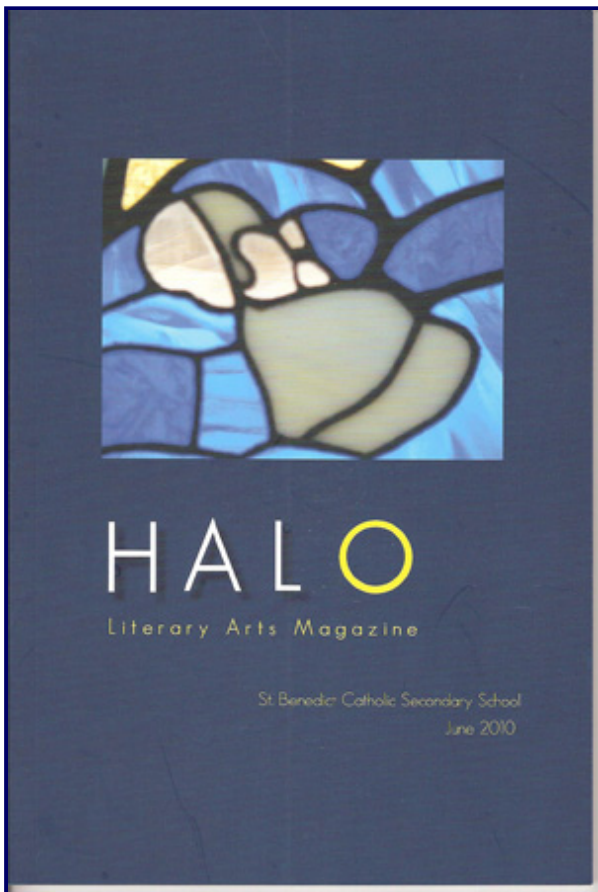

## END OF AN ERA

Tia Semplonius led the Saints for the last time this year on the track. Tia won double gold at the District 8 Championships in the senior girls 100 and 200 meter. Tia advanced through COWSSA in Kitchener by winning the 200 meter and finishing second in the 100 meter. At the OFSAA West Regional qualifier in Windsor, Tia captured a bronze medal in the 100 meter and finished 4th in the 200 meter to qualify to her fifth OFSAA championship in as many years. Tia capped off her season finishing 11th in both the senior girls 100 and 200 meter.

Tia has represented St. Benedict exceptionally well over the last 5 years on the track. Tia demonstrated commitment and perseverance recording 7 top ten finishes in Ontario including her double gold in the junior girls 100 and 200 meter. Her presence will be missed on the track.
