THE APPLICATION DEADLINE FOR UNIVERSITY AND COLLEGE IS APPROACHING QUICKLY!

Grade 12 students who are planning to apply to either college or university for the 2011 - 2012 academic year are reminded that the application deadline is quickly approaching. Please note the following:

- University applications are due January 12, 2011. Students need a PIN number to apply. These numbers are available for pick-up in the guidance office.
- College applications are due February 1, 2011. Students need their OEN number (found on all report card) to set up an account for application.
- Apply early and avoid the stress of last minute on-line delays. Both the OUAC and OCAS sites become overloaded the closer it gets to the deadline date.
- Complete your Community Service Hours as soon as possible
- Review your semester two timetable if you think that you need to make any changes.

EVA VERTES: AN INSPIRATION TO US ALL

What she studies: How cancer moves through the body and resists treatment

Her age when she began research in a university lab: fourteen

Her inspiration: Her grandmother, also named Eva Vertes, who was a chemist and died at 44 from cancer

Eva Vertes is an Alzheimer's and cancer researcher, born in 1985. She attended Highland H.S. in Hamilton, Ontario. She is currently a University of Florida College of Medicine student pursuing her M.D. degree. She attended Princeton University as an undergraduate and was recognized as a teenager for her research, which found a correlation between stem cells and brain cancer. This finding is the basis of her argument that cancer itself is the body's natural self-repair system in error.

DR ENCOUNTER WITH FAITH AND HOSPITALITY

On Saturday, November 13th, 22 students representing each of the WCDSB secondary schools, along with four Board Staff, embarked on a week-long adventure of cultural challenge and social justice learning in the Dominican Republic. St. Benedict Representatives were Lauren Hummel and Alli McKinnon, along with Mr. Betik. By staying with host families, visiting and dialoguing with many poor and marginalized of the DR, the

program attempts to provide a transformative experience to students and staff in order that we may live in solidarity with impoverished and often exploited people in the DR and throughout the world.

We were provided with several opportunities to witness extreme poverty first hand, especially on the *bateyes*. These bateyes are small communities of Haitians (many who have been trafficked) on sugar cane plantations. These people struggle to survive without access to health care and proper sanitary conditions; clean water and adequate food are daily challenges. The brutal working and living conditions of these Haitian cane cutters and their families evoked a deep emotional reaction from all of us.

The group also had the opportunity to have our 'cushy' lifestyles challenged. Albeit for a few moments at the internet café (to inform parents and friends that we were okay), we were without our regular access to email, net surfing, cell phones and MP3 players. Our bathing and washroom experiences were also different—no warm showers for us—and the water often came from the 'big bucket' and not the faucet. We did learn to 'share' our temporary homes with the native insects and rodents, some of which were quite large. Our comfort zones were certainly challenged.

During all of this, wonderful new relationships were being formed. We experienced the gracious hospitality of our

Dominican host families. They were warm, caring and very generous. We were kept well fed with local cuisine and plenty of smiles. Many participants expressed the wonderment of developing such strong bonds, so quickly, with host families despite the communication barrier. It was comforting that the common language of laughter, games, sport and play is such a powerful connector. In the end there were many tears as good-byes were exchanged amongst new friends.

In short, our Dominican experience has left us with powerful lasting memories that will leave all of us changed in some way.. Hopefully it will renew in us our call to live out gospel values of faith, hospitality and justice wherever we go.

A YEARBOOK TO REMEMBER!

There will be a special gift underneath Anne Marie Silva's Christmas tree this year from an old friend at Bennies.

In early December, Mr. Curtis, our yearbook supervisor, got a desperate phone call from Donna Mielke. She wondered if there was a chance that she could get a copy of the 1973 yearbook from the year that she graduated. Mr. Curtis advised her that, although there was a pile of old yearbooks in the storage room, he doubted that they went back that far.

Christmas magic was at work that day because, low and behold, Mr. Curtis found believe we had the one she was looking for."

The old yearbook was slightly damaged, since it was previously owned by Father Morelli, a former teacher at the junior high school in the 60s and 70s.

"The yearbook is a Christmas gift for Anne Marie Silva, an old friend who lives in B.C., and she will be thrilled to know that it belonged to Father Morelli," explains Ms Mielke. "We both graduated in 1972 and she lost school yearbook. Sometimes it's the only thing that remains after those memorable years."

Now, if only Mr. Curtis can find a former student of Notre Dame Academy in Welland who graduated in 1962.


