Our gymnasium was alive with enthusiastic cheering and standing ovations typically reserved for our sports teams as proud parents, siblings and grandparents joined us to celebrate this important milestone. In addition to being presented with their diplomas, many graduates were also recognized for the outstanding contributions that they have made to our school and our community.

A highlight of the evening was a musical interlude, performed by Tonya Botting, Jessica McKay and Chantale Pomerleau, all members of the graduating class which was accompanied by a slide show of our graduates. Chantale Pomerleau was chosen by her class as Valedictorian and her address was a tribute to all that we can do as individuals to make a difference in this world.

POST-SECONDARY TIMELINE

- 1. College and University visits will draw to a close this month. Please check the school website for the schedule of remaining visits.
- 2. **Grade 12 students should still continue to do specific institution research** at the <u>E-info site</u> for universities and at the <u>Ontario Colleges</u> website for colleges.
- 3. **On-line application tutorials** will also help students gather the information that will be needed for the eventual application process.
- 4. Now is a great time to **arrange for a campus visit or tour at institutions that are of interest.** Most colleges and universities typically host these events in the fall, as well as in the spring. Check the guidance bulletin board as well as your email distribution list updates for more information about specific school open house dates.
- 5. The OUAC PIN numbers which are needed for university application have not yet arrived; however as soon as they do, students will be notified. College application requires students to use their OEN numbers (found on all report cards) to set up their college application accounts.
- 6. Students are encouraged to **complete their application prior to leaving for the Christmas break** as both the OUAC and OCAS systems tend to become overloaded as the deadline for applications approaches.
- 7. **Review your semester two timetable** to make sure that you have all of the necessary pre-requisite courses.
- 8. Complete your Community Service Hours!!
- Be prepared to wait for confirmation of acceptance from schools. Each institution
 has its own timeline. Try not to let anxiety about acceptance interfere with your
 progress at school.

APPRENTICESHIP PRESENTATION

If you are interested in learning more about pathways that lead to apprenticeships in the trades, stay tuned for information regarding a presentation that will be held at St. Benedict on November 24th. This presentation will be held during the school day and any student in grades 10, 11 or 12 will be welcome to attend. The presentation, being hosted by the Waterloo Catholic District School Board, will explain the various opportunities that are available for students through the many apprenticeship, OYAP and dual credit programs that are offered through our school and school board.

USED UNIFORMS

Students who are interested in expanding their school wardrobe should be aware that the school has a good supply of clean, quality used uniform pieces available. Anyone who is interested in obtaining uniform clothing should contact their guidance counsellor. Only a limited selection of pants is available at this time. There is no set fee for clothing, however donations would be welcome.


