ENRICHING THE LIVES OF STUDENTS

IDC4U: INTERDISCIPLINARY STUDIES FOR AUTONOMOUS LEARNERS

In Unit One, the students investigated critical and creative thought. Benjamin Bloom created Bloom's Taxonomy for categorizing the level of abstraction of questions that commonly occur in critical thinking. The students will apply this taxonomy in a tutorial setting while they analyze Malcolm Gladwell's Outlier's - understanding that the better the question, the better the answer.

Using William's Taxonomy, the students looked at the creative thought process. Students learned that innovation is important to the advancement of society around the world. New and innovative products can increase the standard of living and provide people with opportunities to improve their lives. Each student selected a product of their choice and followed its path from innovation to modern-day, looking at the historical context, influence and impact. Students investigated the following: washing machine, Kindle Fire eBook readers, sodium nitrate preservative, microphone, light bulb, itunes, airplanes, movies, and automobiles, to name a few.

Next: Looking at Leonardo DaVinci - a universal genius:

- Geniuses look at problems in many different ways

- · Geniuses produce
- · Geniuses make novel combinations
- Geniuses force relationships
- · Geniuses think in opposites
- · Geniuses think metaphorically




