Attention Grade 12 Students Planning to Attend Graduation in June!!

All grade 12 students who are planning to attend the Graduation Ceremony this June are reminded that graduation registration forms and fees are due to the guidance office by Friday, May 3. After years of holding the Graduation Ceremony in October, St. Benedict is moving to a

June Graduation date this year. The Graduation Ceremony for the class of 2013 will be celebrated on Wednesday, June 26 at Conestoga College in the Recreation Complex. The change of venue was needed to accommodate what we hope to be a higher number of graduate attendees, as well as to provide guests with the comforts of an air conditioned facility. All grade 12 students who have not completed their community service hours are reminded that this is a requirement for graduation and are encouraged to take care of this important detail as soon as possible. Students who have not completed their community service hours prior to the graduation ceremony on June 26, will not be eligible to participate in the graduation ceremony.

Summer School

Summer school will be available this summer for St. Benedict students through the Waterloo Region District School Board, our coterminous board. Make-up credit courses will be offered at Jacob Hespeler Secondary School in Cambridge and Cameron Heights Secondary School in Kitchener.

A selected number of new credit courses will be offered at Jacob Hespeler Secondary School in Cambridge, Sir John A. Macdonald Secondary School in Waterloo and Bluevale Collegiate in Waterloo.

Classes will begin on Wednesday, July 3 and will run until Friday, July 26. Make-up courses are 3 hours in length, either morning or afternoon, while new credit courses are 6 hours in length, not including a 30 minute nutrition break. Students can register for a maximum of 2 make up credits or on 3 new credit course. More information regarding summer school course offerings and registration is available in the guidance office. Please note that students interested in taking a new credit course in summer school must register by June 13. Students planning to take a make-up course have until June 26 to register. Biology Students On the Hunt for Bugs!

The grade 12 biology class has been selected to take part in a province-wide genetics program through the Ontario Genomics Institute.

The Biodiversity Institute of Ontario (BIO) has teamed up with 60 schools from across Ontario to explore the insect diversity in their schoolyards through DNA barcoding, a genetic technique for identifying organisms.

Using a Malaise trap – a tent-like apparatus for collecting insects – we hope to collect a large variety of insect specimens, that will then have their DNA scanned and posted in an online library for all to see. Students set up the trap last week and our bug collecting session runs until Friday, May 3rd.

We were recently visited by the BIOBus, a mobile field laboratory (it looks strikingly similar to an RV), and students were introduced to the life of a field biologist and DNA barcoding.

Julia Wittmann and Tully McWatters finished second in TV/Video production (team of 2). Jordan Tamborine

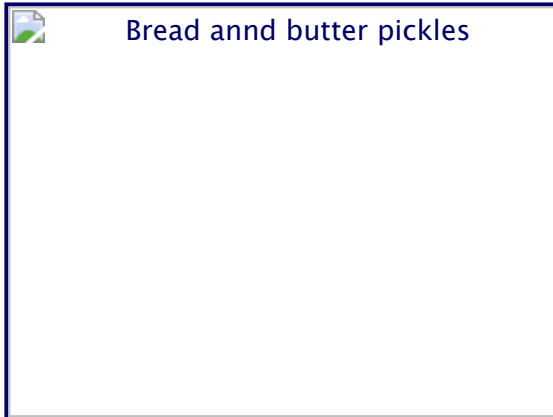
