Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test Thursday, March 27, 2014

Overview of the test and its purpose:

- The OSSLT is written by grade ten students who are working toward an Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD).
- The OSSLT is based on the curriculum expectations of all subjects up to and including grade nine. It is not solely based on English curriculum expectations.
- Students are required to meet Ontario standards—the passing grade is the equivalent to 75%. Students must pass both reading and writing activities to fulfill their literacy requirement.
- Students receiving Accommodations or Special Provisions will receive a letter in the mail outlining their available accommodations. If you have any questions or concerns regarding these accommodations please contact your son/daughter's special education monitor or email Leisha. Craftchick@wcdsb.ca to discuss.
- Students who are unsuccessful on their first attempt may write the test the following year. If they are again unsuccessful, they may enrol in the Ontario Secondary School Literacy Course (the OSSLC) with principal's approval. If a student passes this course, he / she will fulfill his/her literacy requirement.

Additional Literacy Supports Available:

- The Student Success Centre will be offering after school prep sessions for all students. No prior arrangements necessary just drop in Monday Friday from 2:30–4:00.
- The Student Success Centre will also make available a number of support resources (e.g. Don't Panic 2.0 On-the-Go Practice for the OSSLT Print Edition) that students are welcome to access.
- Information sessions will take place in all Grade 10 homerooms leading up to the test. Additional sessions are offered for all senior students who still need to fulfill the literacy requirement.
- Grade 10 students will also participate in prep sessions during their regular scheduled classes leading up to the test.






