Happy Catholic Education Week!

This week there have been many activities planned in celebration of Catholic Education Week. Here is but a few of those things which occurred over the first few days this week.

Grade 9 and 12 students got an opportunity to listen to guest speaker Lisa Nice from Women's Crisis Services of Waterloo Region. She spoke of the need to develop an awareness of some of the violence issues right within our community in the form of domestic violence.

One of the activities she did with the students was a look at the myths and facts of domestic violence, which stimulated a lot of conversation. She talked to students about some of the

common signs of abuse, drawing on her experience of working with victims.

She also reiterated that domestic violence is not just physical; it is also verbal, emotional, psychological, or sexual. Her informative talk also included statistics both nationally and locally.

She encouraged students to seek help from one of several local organisations if they found themselves in an abusive relationship.

Students also had an opportunity to hear a guest speaker from the YWCA who spoke about



body image. Young people today are bombarded by all sorts of messages that make them question whether or not they are good enough, attractive enough, wear the right clothes—basically fit in. Gender stereotypes often make young people feel insecure in who they really are, as they try to make everyone fit into the same mold. Most times it is intentional: the more inadequate young people are made to feel, the more products they will buy to help them improve their self image. The main message in the presentation: be true to your self, and be happy with who you are. You are a beautiful person, don't let anyone else tell you that you are not.



This morning we celebrated a school-wide Mass, and the gym became our sacred space. The Mass was presided over by Father Freitas from St. Mary of the Visitation Parish. Our entrance and offertory processions were lead by Mrs. Beyerle's Special Education students, who did a fantastic job. Our music was lead by Mrs. Rodrigues's grade 11 and 12 instrumental music classes, and the Glee Club directed by Mr. Renner.

We took a minute at the beginning of our gathering to remember three students whom we

have lost over the last few months: Kayla Baker, Oliver Konopacki, and Victoria Northover. There was a beautiful tribute to them with our musicians giving a wonderful rendition of Michael Jackson's "You are not alone" while students processed to the cross and placed flowers in front of it.

Father Freitas's homily focused on us all being fans, whether it's of the Leafs, or his Bruins (and he never mentioned my Habs).... but as Catholics we are called to be fans of Christ. And just like when teams don't do well, our faith will be challenged; our loyalties will be questioned. It is at these times that a solid faith in what we believe in is a sign of who true fans are. God calls us to be His fans, and we must answer the call, as difficult as it is at times. And there we will find true happiness in life.





For today's mass we were also joined by Mr. David DeSantis and Mrs. Maria Ivankovic, Superintendents of Learning with our Board. They both also participated in the readings, sharing them with out students.

Graduation Forms Past Due!!

The deadline to submit graduation forms was Friday, May 2, however we are happy to extend this deadline if there are students who wish to attend but have not yet registered. If your son or daughter falls into this category, please encourage them to take care of this important detail as soon as possible. Graduation will be held on Wednesday, June 25 at the Recreation Complex of Conestoga College. Please note that the completion of community service hours is a diploma requirement and students who have not completed their community service hours will not be eligible to graduate. Students are asked to have their completed Community Service Hours forms handed in to the main office by Friday, May 30. Please contact the guidance office if you have questions.

Grade 12 Post-Secondary Information Update

- 1. All students can expect to hear an admission response to all university programs that they applied to by May 29, 2014. Students interested in accepting an offer of admission should do so by June 2, 2014.
- 2. The Admission Information Service (AIS) will be available through OUAC (Ontario University Application Center) from early June to August for applicants who have not been accepted to programs of their choice or for students who still wish to apply to university for September. All known openings in all university programs will be posted by the AIS at www.ouac.on.ca/ais/
- 3. Students who did not apply to college are welcome to apply on-line for September, 2014 to any program that is still accepting applications. See www.ontariocolleges.ca for more information.

Summer School Registration is now open for all students who are considering taking either a new credit course or a make-up course this July. The registration deadline for new credit courses is June 12 and the registration deadline for make-up courses is June 26, however students who know that they want to attend summer school are encouraged to register early to ensure a spot in the program. Scrabble Dictionary Adds New Fan-Voted Word


