Grade 10 Students Participate in the Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT) Practice Test

In November, all grade 10 students at St. Benedict were asked to complete a practice Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT). We have tried to make the test as authentic as possible so that students become accustomed to the format and timing of the test, as well as its evaluation.

In the days to come, your son or daughter will be bringing home their evaluated test with an information form that provides a snapshot of individual strengths and areas requiring improvement. Please review this information with your child. If your son or daughter does not bring home their test results, they may have been in one of the three grade 10 classes selected to participate in an online field test. Feedback will be provided regarding their results once this information is made available.

Preparing for the March 26th OSSLT

- Attend after-school remedial sessions for extra help and tips on taking the OSSLT which will begin in February. A qualified teacher will be offering sessions every Monday and Wednesday after school from 2:15-3:45. If you are interested in registering for practice sessions, please email Leisha.Craftchick@wcdsb.ca.
- Visit the Student Success Centre (Room 208) to pick up a copy of DON'T PANIC 2.0 ON-THE-GO PRACTICE FOR THE OSSLT PRINT EDITION while supplies last.
- Visit the EQAO website at www.eqao.com to review the Getting Ready Guide and complete the Sample Test Materials.
- Practice using reading strategies, such as skimming, predicting and inferring, to complete tasks. Visit websites such as http://dpcdsb.org/CEC/Programs/EQAO/EQAOTests/OSSLT.htm.
- Practice using multiple choice test taking strategies (see these websites for tips: http://studygs.net/tsttak3.htm or http://www.testtakingtips.com/test/multiple.htm) to improve performance on multiple choice questions.
- Use the full writing process (brainstorming, first draft, revising and editing) for written assignments in all classes.
- Write in full and complete sentences, write paragraphs with proper topic sentences and concluding sentences, develop topics in writing that have a clear focus and direction, and have your work peer edited.


