
Best of luck to all our students as they approach the end of the semester. We hope you will be proud of all of your accomplishments, and you do your best on your exams! Resolve to succeed!

App Development gives students some real life experiences

On Friday, January 9, Mr. Milardovic's grade 11 computer programming/computer science class got to attend a special party at the Board Office. They were celebrating the launch of their apps as part of the Apps4Learning program, which they had spent the last several weeks developing.

The programmers developed apps for Ms. Figueiredo's grade 6 class at St. Joseph's elemenary school. The students (whom we referred to as the *clients*) came up with ideas for apps based on the grade 6 curriculum. The grade 11 students (referred to as the *developers*) used the clients' ideas, questions, and overall vision to then design the app.

Students enjoyed the real world experience and got an opportunity to work as part of a team to create a finished product. Students learned very quickly that app development is not simply a matter of sitting at a computer and coding—there was a lot of consultation with the client (analysis), planning on paper (design), and only after the client approved the mock up and paper plans was the computer used as a tool in the development process. Students designed graphics, backgrounds, and buttons, and then subsequently linked the pages of their apps to provide users with feedback and direction.

After several consultations between October and December, the students got the opportunity to show off their apps, and see those created by classes from the other four high schools in our Board in consultation with an elementary school class. A lot of the students received compliments for their apps, and many enjoyed showing theirs off. Students also used the time to talk to students from the other high schools to see what they had developed.

As a teacher, I was very pleased to have had my class selected to be a part of Apps4Learning, and I enjoyed working not only with my students but also with the students from St. Joe's on this project. Students enjoyed the real world experience and got an opportunity to work as part of a team to create a finished product. They got to deal with decision making, concensus building, compromise, and dealing with limitations with hardware, software, resources, and time.

It took a lot of people to put the Apps4Learning program together, we thank Mr. Rob Holowack from the Board Office for all his work, as well as the Business & Education Partnership and Junior Achievement for their time, resources and support. And finally, a big thank you to the LiveApp team for donating space on their server for our projects!


