What is Specialist High Skills Major (SHSM)?

The Specialist High Skills Major (SHSM) is a Ministry approved program that encourages students to focus their education on a specific employment sector.

Components include:

- 1. A bundle of courses related to a major
- 2. Co-op experience in an area of interest
- 3. Industry-recognized certifications related to the employment sector

Students who successfully complete all components of the program earn a Specialist High Skills Major (Red Seal) designation on their Diploma.

Why get involved?

No matter which path you follow after high school, you will have a better idea of your direction and future career choice when graduating with a SHSM Red Seal. You will:

- understand how and why your classes apply to your future career
- obtain training and certifications from experienced industry staff (e.g. First Aid & CPR)
- learn on-the-job skills during a co-op placement
- gain experience in your field of interest

School Cash Online Survey

Payments for School Items / Trips

As of April 2015, all schools in the Waterloo Catholic District School Board (WCDSB) use School Cash Online.

School Cash Online offers parents the convenience of making online payments for their child/children's field trips, pizza days, milk program, agendas, yearbook, spirit wear, donations, school fundraising etc. This will help remove cash from schools and provide a convenient way for parents to pay for school-related items. School Cash Online allows for parents to maintain an electronic receipt history for items purchased. It provides parents with more flexibility and control over how they distribute payments to the school.

WCDSB is reviewing additional payment methods for School Cash Online and is looking for parent feedback. Currently parents are offered 2 methods of payment: eCheque and My Wallet.

ECheque

An eCheque is an electronic funds transfer that withdraws money directly from your bank account. It is just like writing a cheque, only it is done electronically. When you send money with an eCheque, the transaction will be held as pending until the electronic funds have cleared your bank.

School Cash Online does not store your eCheque details for security reasons. Therefore, parents must enter the information every time they checkout.

My Wallet

Parents deposit a sum of money into "My Wallet" on the School Cash Online website. You will be able to draw down on the preloaded funds to pay for student items and check out. It takes seven business days to load "My Wallet" and use the funds to purchase items. Fund transferred into "My Wallet" do not expire and remain available for purchases until funds are fully drawn down.

St. Benedict Students Finalists in International Business Competition

Three students from St. Benedict Catholic Secondary School have proven they are among the best business students in North America. Tyler DeSousa, Adam Lainey and Trevor O'Hagan travelled to Orlando, Florida from April 23 to 30 to represent St. Benedict and Ontario at DECA's International Career Development Conference.

The team of three competed in the Sports and Entertainment Operations Research Marketing competition. The event required conducting research and creating a marketing plan to target an underserviced generation for a sports or entertainment business. The students chose the Hamilton Bulldogs as the basis of their campaign and created a marketing plan, report and presentation to attract more Millennials to the games.

Team DeSousa, Lainey, and O'Hagan placed 2nd overall at the DECA Ontario Provincial competition in February, qualifying them for the international competition in Orlando. In Orlando, the young men faced tough competition from not only Ontario but all 50 United States, a competition that draws in excess of 10,000 high school competitors. DeSousa, Lainey and O'Hagan placed in the top 10 of their category, a feat not easily achieved. St. Benedict Catholic Secondary School is very proud of their accomplishment and look forward to another DECA competition year with these students as they enter grade 12.

Bennies 2015 Mental Health Awareness Week

From May 4th to May 8th, Mental Health Awareness Week was celebrated here at St. Bennies. The week was planned by the Mental Health Awareness Week committee, led by youth care worker Ms. Schuster, social worker Sandra Ayerst, and myself, Nyawuor Malek, as student leader.

We wanted to give staff and students the opportunity to learn more about mental health, mental illness, coping strategies, and resources for help. Oftentimes people are afraid or feel uncomfortable talking about this topic because of the stigma surrounding it. This shouldn't be the case, as mental health is a part of each and every one of our lives.

We wanted to give staff and students the opportunity to learn more about mental health, mental illness, coping strategies, and resources for help.

Through this week, we also wanted to break the stigma around mental health and get the conversation started. This was completed through activities and events –spreading knowledge and understanding among the community.

The week was introduced the Friday before through an SBTV special. The Mental Health Awareness Week Committee worked with the SBTV crew to create a memorable and informative experience for the Bennies Community.

First off was the Happy Video, in which students danced to the song happy while holding up signs about what makes them happy as well as positive mental health. There was also a Speaker's Corner, which provided Bennies students the opportunity to speak about the stigma of Mental Illness within the community. Lastly, there was a Myth vs Reality video that explained some common misconceptions about mental health and mental illness. These videos were an amazing way to introduce Mental Health Awareness Week to the community.

An introductory PowerPoint was played to classes on Monday May 4th. This PowerPoint led by Ms. Schuster, outlined important information about mental health which gave the community a sense of understanding. Packages were also distributed to classes, giving the chance for classes to start the conversation about mental health.

On Tuesday May 5th, pre-ordered Mental Health Awareness Week spirit wear T-shirts were distributed to staff and students. An interactive class activity also took place. Classes collaborated and went through a mind your mind interactive website and answered questions to mental health related questions. The site also provided explanations to the questions, making students more aware.

On Wednesday May 6th, the Bennies atrium was full of local organizations for the carousel day. Staff and students were invited to come to the atrium during lunch and period three to go to the information booths. Some of the organizations that came were Ray of Hope, Waterloo Region Suicide Prevention Council, Cambridge Memorial Hospital, and Canadian Mental Health Association. The event left both the Bennies community and the representatives from the organizations very happy.

Lastly on Friday May 8th, the week closed with another class activity. Each class was shown three videos that provided statistics, facts, and awareness about mental health and mental illness. From this information, and knowledge gained throughout the week, classes were tasked with writing their views on a puzzle piece. The mental health awareness week


