St. Benedict Student Wins National Award

For two days in Saskatoon at the 21st Skills Canada National Competition, the best and brightest students and apprentices in skilled trades and technologies were tried, tested and judged. Over 500 young Canadians showcased their talent, reaching for gold by competing in over 40 disciplines across six industry sectors in front of a crowd of thousands.

Jesse Ventura, a grade 11 St. Benedict Catholic Secondary School student, brought home the Gold medal competing in the Employability sector and the Job Interview/Search category. Each student was

interviewed based on a particular career and completed job search techniques and activities over a two day period.

"The job interview is one of the key components of the job search, so in today's job market, it is important to make a positive impression. A stellar interview is one way to stand out amongst one's peers" shared Rosemarie Brenner, Regional Chair of the Job Interview competition.

After advancing from both the Waterloo Catholic District School Board, and the Ontario Technical Skills Competitions, Ventura moved forward to join his peers from across Canada.

Ventura describes his experience at the Skills Canada National Competition as "Enlightening! I had a chance to meet people from all parts of Canada, see all of the different trades, technologies, careers and opportunities" When asked about his performance at the competition, Ventura humbly replied "I wasn't sure how I'd do. All of the other

competitors felt really confident. But when my name was called, I went crazy, everyone started to hug me. It was a blur."

Michelle Crowell, Skills Mentor and teacher from St. Benedict C.S.S., has been instrumental in Jesse's journey, working with Ventura throughout his co-op experience in school, mentoring him for the competition, and accompanying him to Saskatoon. Crowell believes her student has had a "major life-enhancing experience at Skills Canada, as he interacted with peers from across the country and further developed his already strong communications and networking skills.

The Waterloo Catholic District School Board is proud to support and participate in the Skills Competitions, an event which celebrates student success and achievement. "We are overjoyed by Jesse's accomplishment" states Tara Fitzgerald, School Board Skills Coordinator. "Participating in the Skills Competitions allows students to gain valuable skills and experience needed for their future endeavours".

As for Ventura's plans for next year? "I'll be back to compete in my final year" he states. "I'm hoping to mentor younger students in the school, and inspire others to get involved to further develop their interview skills". His message to his peers and youth stands strong: "All you can do is try your best. Maybe you have a passion for skilled trades, for public speaking, whatever it is – just try it out. Even if you won't win, it's an amazing experience just to be involved."



Saints Civics students succeed at charity challenge

Once again St. Benedict Civics students participated in the annual YPI (Youth and Philanthropic Initiative) challenge. YPI is a charitable organization that encourages students to participate in active citizenship by researching a local grassroots charity. Through our Grade 10 Civics classes, students in groups of 2 to 5 choose a local charity, research it through a variety of means, including visitations of the charity, then present to their fellow classmates. Each class selects one group to compete in an all–school final presentation. The winner of that presentation is then given \$5,000 by YPI to present to their chosen charity.

To date, YPI has donated over \$6 million to a variety of charities across Canada. All five of our high schools in the Waterloo Catholic District School Board participate in the YPI project with winners from each school presenting a \$5,000 cheque to needy charities. That means that our students, over the last three years, have been able to provide \$75,000 in funds.
