St. Benedict CSS Receives Major Grant from Hallman Foundation

St. Benedict Catholic Secondary School's Heart of the Community project—aimed at enhancing the school's main sports field for community use—has just received a major boost of \$300,000 from the Lyle S. Hallman Foundation Children and Youth Capital Grants Program. The purpose of this grant program is to increase access to facilities offering recreation and character–building programs for children and youth (0 – 16 years) from low–income families.

The successful application, facilitated by the Waterloo Region Catholic Schools Foundation, is the result of a partnership between St. Benedict Catholic Secondary School, Region of Waterloo Public Health and Emergency Services, Idea Exchange, and Active Cambridge, a non-profit agency working to connect sports and fitness to people. The funds awarded willadd accessible play and recreation facilities to complement the existing infrastructure of sports field, track, fitness stations, school facilities and public library to ultimately create an Integrated Healthy Active Living Centre. This will create a foundation for a wide variety of programming to support the healthy development of youth and families.

The actual design of the facility will be determined through a community consultation process planned for this fall. This consultation will engage community members from the surrounding area as well as students, teachers, parents and community partners to inform both the design of the facility and related programming opportunities.

The \$300,000 awarded from the Hallman Foundation builds on the first phase of the project which came to fruition through the AVIVA Community Fund. St. Benedict Catholic Secondary School was awarded one of the \$100,000 grand prizes through the

AVIVA Community Fund contest—contributing to a \$150,000 overall budget for the first phase of the project which includes enhancement of the track and sports field with an electronic scoreboard and fitness stations. This first phase is planned for completion in August 2015.

Funding for the second phase brings the total scope of the project to \$450,000--moving the vision of the project forward significantly with a focus on supporting the health and wellness of youth and families in the Cambridge community. Completion of the project's second phase is targeted for August 2016.

"We are thankful for the support of the Lyle S. Hallman Foundation and encouraged by their shared optimism for our vision. With the synergies our facility has to offer in conjunction with Idea Exchange and the collective commitment of our community partners we see tremendous potential to create a place for families of all ages to engage in a healthy active lifestyle. 
What is Specialist High Skills Major (SHSM)?

The Specialist High Skills Major (SHSM) is a Ministry approved program that encourages students to focus their education on a specific employment sector.

Components include:

- 1. A bundle of courses related to a major
- 2. Co-op experience in an area of interest
- 3. Industry-recognized certifications related to the employment sector

Students who successfully complete all components of the program earn a Specialist High Skills Major (Red Seal) designation on their Diploma.





No matter which path you follow after high school, you will have a better idea of your direction and future career choice when graduating with a SHSM Red Seal. You will:

- understand how and why your classes apply to your future career
- obtain training and certifications from experienced industry staff (e.g. First Aid & CPR)
- learn on-the-job skills during a co-op placement
