# Report Cards... what now?

As a student, I used to dread report card time. (ICYMI, report cards were distributed yesterday.) I wasn't sure what to expect in terms of mark or comments. If I really thought about it at the time, I probably would have been able to at least ballpark my marks, and perhaps even know which "canned comment" the teacher would use.

Times have changed. Canned comments are a thing of the past. Teachers spend a lot of time putting together comments to identify strengths, address concerns, and recommend next steps to help improve student learning.

Parents, if you haven't had a chance, do sit down with your son or daughter. Take out their report card, and read the comments—together. Then, plan appropriate *next steps* that will result in a level of success that everyone will be happy with: you, your son or daughter, and the teacher.

Also, contact a teacher if you have questions or concerns. It is through these dialogues and discussions that we most effectively collaborate to ensure student success. Not sure about what a comment means? Ask. Not happy with a mark? Ask your son or daughter, and then contact the teacher if needed.

A student who is supported by both parents and teachers is a student who gets the consistent message of "we want to help you succeed". If we can help you help your son or daughter, then let's work together. After all, that's what being the *Heart of the Community:* Success for each, a place for all is all about.

## St. Benedict Students Challenge Inequity

On Thursday, November 17 students of St. Benedict Catholic Secondary School gathered in the school gymnasium to welcome Chris D'souza, a motivational speaker and human rights activist. The healthy schools committee invited D'souza to share his message with the entire school after he had an earlier opportunity to participate in the school Think Tank and address to staff on a PD day. He shared a message that inspired the audience to challenge inequity and ask ourselves what Catholic student leadership looks like.

As a member of the writing team that created the Ministry of Education of Ontario's equity and inclusion education strategy, D'souza presented the audience with some challenges. The students and teachers took in some new information that day. Chris asked some good questions and said some things that made you think a little. One message that was clear to the students was D'souza's challenge to stand up and say, "Not Here!" when we witness any form of discrimination in our school community.

We might not recognize it all the time, but there is discrimination happening around us. The message to be more aware and respond with love was one that D'souza shared. It was appropriate that this guest speaker would share his message to wrap up anti-bullying week. "We want students to have the best experience possible every day they come to St. Benedict's," said Chris D'souza.

It is obvious that, "everybody has a fundamental right to an education," as D'souza shared. He envisioned that as "loving and learning" together, and left the audience with the challenge that Jesus also left us, "to love one another as I have loved you."



## Access student attendance information in real time

Class attendance is a key component to a student's success in their classes. Timely communication of attendance information between home and school is critical for accurate


attendance records.

If a student is away from school a parent must call the attendance line at the school at 519–621–4001. The call can be placed any time, 24 hours a day. It is strongly recommended that you make this call as soon as the absence is known, or at the latest before the student returns to school.

If your son or daughter is going to be away for a trip or extended period of time for a medical reason an *Intent to be Absent* form should be completed in advance by a parent. These are available in the Guidance department.

A student, parent or guardian can access their student's attendance in real time through the Secondary Student Information System (SIS) Website. Information available to view includes student mark history, current timetable, attendance for each course on the current timetable and your contact information. The website link is <a href="https://sis.wcdsb.ca">https://sis.wcdsb.ca</a>.

To access the student specific information, you must have the student number (which can be found on a student's timetable) and birth date. If you cannot locate the student number please call the guidance or attendance office for assistance.



By entering information about your son or daughter you can get up-to-the-minute information about their attendance.

### **Cash Online**

You are now able to pay various fees for your child, such as Student Activity Fee, online using School Cash Online.

For safety and efficiency reasons, we want to reduce the amount of cash coming into our school. We are asking parents to please take 5 minutes to register. Once you are registered online, you will begin receiving emails about upcoming events.

Follow the steps below to register with School Cash Online:

Step 1: Go to the <u>School Cash Online</u>
<u>website</u> or visit our school website and click on the School Cash Online link under the ★.

Step 2: Register by selecting the "Get Started Today" and follow the steps. You will need use the student's LEGAL NAME and their STUDENT NUMBER.

## The Red Stocking Campaign

November 26 to December 11, 2016

#### WHAT IS IT?

St. Mary of the Visitation parish is once again taking on a special outreach project called the Red Stocking Campaign – we invite everyone to be a part of it!

Since 2006, we have invited you to fill Red Stockings with pencils, crayons, bookmarks, candy, educational toys, puzzles, and art supplies to help students in needy African Schools. This will be done in cooperation with Canadian Food for Children (CFFC) which will distribute them to needy children and families.

#### HOW DID WE DO LAST YEAR?

In 2015, St Mary of the Visitation Parish was able to send over 645 Red Stockings (a new record), and several additional shipping boxes; just in time for Christmas delivery! This past Spring, members of the Oblates of Mary Immaculate, the religious order we partner with in this work came to personally visit us on a Lord's Day Weekend to offer thanks and report on our efforts and work in Kenya. Since 2006 we have collected over 3000 Red Stockings!

#### **HOW DOES IT HELP?**

Catholic schools in Kenya Africa are operated by the religious communities of priests, brothers and sisters. They receive very limited funding from the government. Our school supplies provide every student in the school with the supplies they need to aid in their education. This permits the limited funding they have to go toward other needs such as school uniforms for the children, which in many cases would be their own "formal" clothing, and toward food for their daily lunch program, which often is the only meal that a child receives during the day.

#### HOW ARE WE GETTING IT THERE?

Canadian Food for Children (CFFC) is taking care of the shipping of it. CFFC assists Catholic missionaries by collecting the goods they need to do their work in the world. Since its inception, CFFC has, almost daily, shipped containers full of supplies to over 20 countries worldwide which face drought, disease and disaster.

#### ARE OUR PARISH SCHOOLS HELPING?

Yes! All of the classes at our three parish elementary schools will be participating. In addition, our Kids Klub will also be undertaking this project. Students at St. Benedict Secondary School will

be made aware of the project with many home rooms participating.

#### HOW CAN YOU HELP?

Please consider taking a Red Stocking yourself and filling it with Pencils, crayons, book marks, candy, educational toys, puzzles, art supplies, Christmas trinkets, Small Books, Small stuffed animals. Please do not include any food items or anything that could break, leak, melt, or scare and harm a child and return it to the back of the Church before December 13, 2015. All items collected will then be shipped by Canadian Food for Children during that week for Christmas distribution.
