Uniform Review

As the winter weather is upon us we wish to remind parents and students of the school's uniform expectations.

- Students are expected to be in complete uniform which consists of McCarthy uniform bottoms and tops. Uniform tops may only be worn with a white or navy blue t-shirt underneath. Non-uniform tops which could include hoodies, sweatshirts or sweaters are not permitted to be worn underneath.
- Scarves, hats, hoods may not be worn and students should remove these upon entering the building.
 - Jackets or sweaters are permitted between classes for those travelling between the portables and the main building. However, uniform pants are required at all times.
- Track pants, jeans or other non-uniform bottoms are not permitted during the school day.
- During lunch, students are to be in full uniform in the library, cafeteria and any classroom (when in a club or math help etc.). The same expectations regarding proper uniform tops and bottoms apply in these designated areas.

Teachers have been directed to send students with uniform infractions to the Main Office where they will speak with their administrator. Are You Ready for Winter Weather??

It's that time of year! Advent is here, and soon Christmas will be upon us. It's snow season — and that means it's time to review the WCDSB's Inclement Weather Policy.

Winter weather can be very unpredictable. So it's best to be prepared. Here are some key things to remember – because not every day with snow is a snow day:

1. Bad weather — such as a snow storm or frigid temperatures — is always a possibility during the winter months. It is very important to dress appropriately for the conditions.

- 2. During bad weather, schools and board administrative sites may still be open, even if school buses are cancelled.
- 3. At 5:30 a.m. on mornings when inclement weather has been forecast for Waterloo Region, the General Manager of Student Transportation Services of Waterloo Region (STSWR) assesses the current weather conditions – in consultation with local bus companies, if necessary. If a recommendation to cancel transportation (including potential closure of schools) is to be made, the local Directors of Education are contacted and a joint decision is made between STSWR, the WCDSB and the Waterloo Region District School Board.
- 4. All reasonable efforts are made to announce any cancellation of buses or school closures by 6:00 a.m.
- 5. It is recommended that parents, guardians, staff and students tune in a local Waterloo Region radio station and also monitor the following online information sources for information about potential closures or cancellations:

The Red Stocking Campaign

December 3-17, 2017

WHAT IS IT?

Our parish is once again taking on a special outreach project called the Red Stocking Campaign - we invite everyone to be a part of it!

Since 2006, we have invited you to fill Red Stockings with pencils, crayons, bookmarks, candy, educational toys, puzzles, and art supplies to help students in needy African Schools. This will be done in cooperation with Canadian Food for Children (CFFC) which will distribute them to needy children and families.

HOW DID WE DO LAST YEAR?

In 2016, St Mary of the Visitation Parish was able to send over 685 Red Stockings (a new record), and several additional shipping boxes; just in time for Christmas delivery! In May 2015, members of the Oblates of Mary Immaculate, the religious order we partner with in this work came to personally visit us on a Lord's Day Weekend to offer thanks and report on our efforts and work in Kenya. Since 2006 we have collected over 3000 Red Stockings!

HOW DOES IT HELP?

Many Catholic schools in Kenya Africa are operated by the religious communities of priests, brothers and sisters. They receive very limited funding from the government. Our school supplies provide every student in the school with the supplies they need to aid in their education. This permits the limited funding they have to go toward other needs such as school uniforms for the children, which in many cases would be their own "formal" clothing, and toward food for their daily lunch program, which often is the only meal that a child receives during the day.

HOW ARE WE GETTING IT THERE?

Canadian Food for Children (CFFC) is taking care of the shipping of it. CFFC assists Catholic missionaries by collecting the goods they need to do their work in the world. Since its inception, CFFC has, almost daily, shipped containers full of supplies to over 20 countries worldwide which face drought, disease and disaster.

ARE OUR PARISH SCHOOLS HELPING?

Yes! All of the classes at our three parish elementary schools will be participating. In addition, our Kids Klub will also be undertaking this project. Students at St. Benedict Secondary School will be made aware of the project with many home rooms participating.

HOW CAN YOU HELP?

Please consider taking a Red Stocking yourself and filling it with Pencils, crayons, book marks, candy, educational toys, puzzles, art supplies, Christmas trinkets, Small Books, Small stuffed animals. Please do not include any food items or anything that could break, leak, melt, or scare and harm a child and return it to the back of the Church before December 17, 2017. All items collected will then be shipped by Canadian Food for Children during that week for Christmas distribution.

Shuttle runs from 3:30pm - 8:30 p.m., picks you right up at your car, and drops you off at the Church front doors.

Our shuttles will run in between each location every 7 minutes picking up directly at the school (look for the yellow pylon) and will bring you to the front door of the Church. You will be dropped off at our main entrance in minutes!

When you use the shuttle you will receive a "Cafe Coupon" to visit the cafe next Sunday for a free item (ask the driver for a cafe coupon).

Shuttles will also pick up right after Mass and return you safely to your car. Shuttles run throughout the Mass, so in the event that you need to leave at any time, they can take you to your vehicle. There is at least one shuttle always looping - so no one is left behind.


