News from Guidance

Course Selections for 2018 - 2019 due FEBRUARY 28, 2018

As has been the practice for the past number of years, students will be choosing their courses on-line through Career Cruising. All students have received detailed instructions regarding the process for choosing

their classes during our presentations. The site can be accessed as follows:

- 1. Go to the Career Cruising website: www.wcdsb.ca/planner
- 2. Your Username is the prefix "wl-" plus the last 5 digits of your student ID and the first 3 characters of your last name. (eg. John Smith wl-12345SMI)
- 3. Your Password is your birth date. (mmddyyyy) For example, if your birthdate is August 25, 1990 your password will be 08251990. You will be asked to change your password when you log in for the first time. Please note that course selections must be submitted to the school and signed by a parent, by Wednesday February 28. Students are encouraged to consult the course calendar, as well as subject specific teachers and guidance counsellors for help making the correct decisions

Students should return their signed course selection sheet to their designated teacher.

Grade 9 students to their period 2 teacher.

Grade 11 students to their period 3 teacher.

Grade 10 students to their period 4 teacher.

In addition to before school, after school and during the school day, guidance counsellors will also be available during lunch on February 26 and 27 in room 111 to answer any questions.

Specialist High Skills Major (SHSM) and Course Selection

All students who are registered in one of the Specialist High Skills Major programs should have received a report which indicates their progress in their sector of choice. Students should use this report to make sure that they choose courses for next year which will allow them to complete the SHSM academic requirements.






