St. Benedict C. S. S. - Semester 1 Final Evaluation Schedule for January 2020

All courses (except those listed below) will have a 75 minute Final Evaluation taking place on January 24, 27, 28 or 29.

Students who do not meet the above criteria will be required to attend Credit Rescue in the afternoon on these days with the possibility of attending an additional 2 hour Credit Recovery class on February 1 in an attempt to be successful in obtaining their credit.

New Programming Course Offered for Grade 10!

The Business and Computer Studies department is excited to announce a new programming course being offered in 2020 for grade 10s. With sufficient enrollment, we hope to offer the **ICS 20 Introduction to Computer Studies** course.

From the Ministry curriculum document for the course: "This course introduces students to computer programming. Students will plan and write simple computer programs by applying fundamental programming concepts and learn to create clear and maintainable internal documentation. They will also learn to manage a computer by studying hardware configurations, software selection, operating system functions, networking, and safe computing practices. Students will also investigate the social impact of computer technologies and develop an understanding of environmental and ethical issues related to the use of computers."

Students who are considering a career in the computer industry can use this course as an opportunity to

see what programming is about before taking the grade 11 and 12 ICS courses. "I think it's great for students thinking of taking a computer co-op or getting into the Information and Communication Technology High Skills path," says Mr. Milardovic, one of our school's computer teachers, "Students with an actual coding course under their belt before engaging in co-op in grade 11 or 12 will definitely have an advantage in the field."

Not only will students cover the curriculum, but they will also get the opportunity to participate in computer contests and challenges in order to further develop their programming skills.

Did you know that the Communications Department consists of English, French, and Spanish classes? Over the next few weeks you will see some additions to the Language and Communications page of the school website. We are currently in our second year of offering Advanced Placement Grade 12 University English (ENG4UE). This course is a continuation of the Pre-AP courses offered in Grades 9 - 11. Students enrolled in AP English do not do more work than students enrolled in Grade 12 University (ENG4U) - their learning and critical thinking skills are developed to help them pursue successful post-secondary academic careers. Do you see Sector Partner Contextualized Component (SPCC) on your compulsory certifications?

Here is more information about that, from the Ministry of Education

- This required component includes one of the following options: Innovation Creativity and Entrepreneurship (ICE) training, coding and mathematical literacy.
- The Sector-Partnered Contextualized Component will require an approximately 6-hour activity, delivered with a sector partner and have an experiential and an assessment component.

Semester 2 we will be offering some full day sessions with an outside provider to help students complete this requirement.

Or if you are doing something with an outside partner through school or the community (think ICE Challenge, APPS for Learning, E-car, Robotics competitions, Programming contests, DECA, Mock UN, Drama Festival, HOSA competition, Art Battle Stock competition, Skills Canada) **this could count.**

Green Bin Program coming to St. Benedict in January!

Did you know that food waste takes up about 40% of landfill space?

Did you know that when food waste breaks down in a landfill, methane gas -- a harmful greenhouse gas that's MUCH worse than carbon dioxide in terms of its power to contribute to Global Warming -- is produced?

Did you know that when food waste is properly composted and collected in green bin programs, it turns into healthy soil and fertilizer that is sold locally to farmers?

Thanks to an incredibly generous grant from the Waterloo Catholic Schools Foundation, we are now able to implement a green bin program right here at St Benedict - and we need your help!

Starting this month, green bins will be stationed throughout the school, and students, staff, and community members using the building will all be responsible for making sure the right stuff goes in them, and the wrong stuff stays out.

Here's a helpful guide. Please review it with your children to ensure the success of this program, and help the St. Benedict community stand up for our environment, take action on Climate Change, and embrace its

role in acting as stewards of the Earth!

What goes in: All food waste, paper towels, plates, napkins, pet waste, indoor plants

The infographic displays various items accepted in the green bin, categorized as follows:

- Fruits and vegetables: Broccoli, corn, banana, apple core, cheese.
- Dairy (cheese, butter, yogurt): Cheese, butter.
- Egg shells: Broken egg.
- Fish, meat and bones: Fish, meat.
- Seafood and shells: Mussels, shrimp.
- Grains, pasta and rice: Pasta, rice.
- Snack foods: Chips, nuts, candy.
- Baked goods (bread, cereal, cookies, pizza): Pizza, cookies, bread.
- Pet waste (put in paper or certified compostable bags, or wrap in newsprint): Pet waste in a bag.
- Cut flowers: Flowers.
- Shredded paper (handfuls only): Shredded paper.
- Paper bags, paper towels and napkins, paper plates and facial tissues: Paper bags, paper towels, paper plates, facial tissues.
- Coffee filters, grounds and tea bags: Coffee filters, grounds, tea bags.

What stays out: These items are not accepted in the green bin program

- Feminine hygiene products: Feminine hygiene products.
- Diapers: Diapers.
- Plastic cutlery: Plastic cutlery.

- Sponges: Sponges.
- Cigarette butts: Cigarette butts.
- Corks: Corks.
- Gum: Gum.
- No more than 1 cup of liquid: Liquid.
- Plastic bags: Plastic bags.

Introduction to Emotional Freedom Technique to Help Manage Exam Stress- Youth Workshop

In our introduction to Emotional Freedom Technique (EFT) we will introduce and experience EFT or tapping as we calm the brain and focus on the stress we feel when we think and prepare for exams.

WHAT IS TAPPING?

- Some people call it psychological or emotional acupuncture because tapping combines thinking about the problem in a different way while stimulating acupressure points to release emotion.
- Tapping can be used for a range of problems, uncomfortable feelings and thoughts that may be a belief that is not true.
- Lots of research has been done in the last 10 years with EFT and the technique or 'Energy Modality' has become evidence based.
- Normally we choose to tap on something we want to change, in this introduction, we will focus on the feelings that participants are experiencing as they prepare for and think of exams.

Facilitators- Linda Stearns, Lauren Portengen -Community Resource Program

Hi, my name is Linda Stearns, I am an accredited, certified Emotional Freedom Practitioner with a passion for this modality of Energy Psychology. I have been a practicing practitioner/facilitator for over 6 years and continue to be astonished with the power of this energy work. I have worked with hundreds of children/youth and families and witnessed their transformations. I have worked for Carizon Family and Community Services for over 15 years and am so grateful that I am able to share and learn from the families I have worked with.

Hello, my name Lauren Portengen. I work at Carizon in the Community Resource Program and recently started the path to become a certified Emotional Freedom Practitioner. While I have only been involved with EFT for a year, it has quickly become an essential part of my own self-care and my work with others. I am constantly in awe of how effective and healing energy work can be. It has been a privilege to learn this modality both in for my own well-being and in my role as a support to others.
