Finding Keywords and Search Terms For each keyword write alternative keywords including synonyms, alternative spellings and related terms. These keywords will become the search terms you will use in the library's databases. Use an online dictionary, thesaurus or encyclopedia to find alternate terms if necessary.					
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Constructing Your Search

Now combine your keywords together to create a "search statement". Use these tips to help you.

1.Use Boolean operators AND, OR, NOT

AND – narrows a search OR – broadens a search

NOT – exclude terms from a search

- 2. Do phrase searching: use quotations marks "" or brackets () to keep phrases together: for example: "Second World War", Canada AND (climate change OR global warming).
- 3. Use truncation to include variations in spelling and forms of words. use an asterisk * in place of the word ending: for example, child* will search child, children, childhood, childrens

Refine Your Search

- 1.Gale databases/ebooks allow searches to be refined by full-text, peer-reviewed, publication title, document type and subject.
- 2. Try searches in different databases.
- 3. Use the advanced search function in the database.
- 4.Try doing a subject search instead of a keyword search. A keyword search searches are broad and a good start. Subject searching uses subject headings assigned by the database and offers more specific searching. Results can be highly relevant.
