- De-stream for math started Sept 2021 and the remaining courses (English, Science, Geography, French) will happen for Sept 2022
- De-stream classes will be teaching the Academic curriculum
- Transportation challenges many challenges today
 - Many different causes absentee of drivers, weather, late runs
 - Feedback from members: notification not consistent for parents, lack of understanding from teachers (not all) when absent from class
 - Transportation challenges is adding stress to all, including drivers, students, parents and teachers we need to be understanding of all situations
- Return to school brings changes to the process that we having been doing
 - No more Case and contact tracing
 - Tracking is based on attendance as request by the Province
 - Friday, we saw absentee above 20% as reported in the media but was expected since there was a PA Day for elementary school, day of the meeting there was only 17%
 - 30% absentee does not automatically mean school closure this will initiate conversation with Public Health to see what is going on in the school
 - Using attendance could be misleading because if people are away do to trips not Covid/illness they are in that count - but attendance is definitely higher than is usually expected
- 300 students decided to take advantage of the short-term remote learning option
- Pause to sports hope to start up practices once we are back in 2nd Semester
- Lunch time is the biggest challenge
 - using gym 1, lecture hall but the limitation of #of students allowed in cafeteria does not help
 - hope the numbers go down so more options become available
- 3 masks were distributed to the students upon return and rapid tests went out this week
- Future Saints
 - No grade 8 nights again will be virtual for the families
 - Course selection material and swag were at the Elementary school in time for the students return
 - Many virtual activities are available for classes, parent and students to explore
- Guidance
 - Course selection starts in Feb, expect emails from Guidance with more information
 - Lunch time sessions will be available in career centre
- Covid Isolation
 - Almost all classes have a virtual class set up for students to be able to get material if required to do isolation.
 - The only classes that are not setup virtually are Tech/Gym classes
