- Covid Restrictions have been removed
 - Best tool is to use school screening application updated according to latest guidelines

- School size has grown, approximately 1720 students, 105 teachers, 16 EA/CYW, 11 Custodians
- New Vice Principal Mr. Figueiredo
- Upcoming dates:

 - Opening liturgy will be held before Thanksgiving. Grade 9's will celebrate in the gym with the rest of the school by live stream.

 - o Volunteer hours for Graduates are back up to 40 hours

 - Revised Sci & Tech for grades 1-8
 - De-stream Grade 9 science course
